WC for students returning from Italy early due to COVD-19: Kerryellen Vroman, GEC, contacted Nicky about allowing 96 students who are being forced to return to the US from Italy early due to COVID-19 be allowed to have WC requirement fulfilled. These students will have been in Italy 5-6 weeks, just shy of the 8-week (approved program) abroad rule for fulfilling WC.

Motion: Dawn Meredith moved and Greg McMahon seconded to allow the World Cultures (WC) requirement be fulfilled for students returning early from Italy due to the COVID-19 outbreak during the S20 semester.

DRC Proposal presented to the Faculty Senate – Nicky shared the DRC's proposed Discovery/GenEd template and first year Wildcat Critical Thinking Seminar presented to the Faculty Senate on Mar 2, 2020. The DC discussed each area – Wildcat Foundations, including Wildcat Critical Thinking Seminar; Knowledge Categories; Ways of Communicating; Global & Societal Challenges; Capstone. Early feedback from some faculty and colleges is that the proposal "looks good on paper," but there are concerns about its feasibility. Discussion included (but was not limited to): coding in DegreeWorks; feasibility of students being required to take 24 credits outside of their college; next steps with Faculty Senate and colleges.

The DRC is planning to hold "Open House" sessions on Mar 24 & 25, for discussion of the proposals. Once those sessions are confirmed, Amy will send the info to the DC.
