1098-T Form

- 1098-T Forms are mailed to a students' permanent mailing address at the end of January
- Forms for current and past years can also be accessed online



1098-T Form

1. Go to tra.maximus.com
2. If this is your first time using the site, choose “Login” on the left, then the purple button to “Register”

3. Input the student's first and last name, and ID number, or last 5 of SSN to set up an account
4. You will be able to view or print all UNH 1098-Ts the student has had

Registration

You must enter either the last 5 digits of your Social Security Number or your full Student ID, AND your full first and last name in order to be authenticated in this system. Note, the Student ID method will only work if your school has reported your Student ID to us. Many do not. Further, you must enter your name as it was provided to us by your school. If you've had a name change, you should use the name that was in use at the end of the tax year.
