Motivation

Accountability and Ownership

- Assign roles
- Have students pick the tasks/learning content



Accountability and Ownership

- Use group Project to increase engagement
 - Group size
 - Regular check-in
 - Individual: contribution (activity logs), reflection, peer-evaluation
 - Group: project deliverable (paper?), final presentation



Novelty

- Keep your course relevant, timely, and current
- Examples
 - Use discussion board to share
 - Novel assignments like students created infographics, audio/video

 - Use rubrics
 - Keep the grading simple



DB for Large Class

- Example 1: fishbowl activity
 - 60 students, make 10 groups
 - 2 groups debate and the rest of the class will observe
 - each group posts in the public DB area or submit a group paper



DB for Large Class

- Example 2: <u>Peer review discussion board</u>
 - Explain the value to your students and show students how to participate
 - Ensure students know what to do with the feedback
 - Submit a paper as a final product
