## KSC:

If a student is indicating to you that this (the May 1<sup>st</sup> deposit of \$425) would be too much of a financial burden at this time, Peggy Richmond would like you, the advisor to email her ( <a href="mrichmon@keene.edu">mrichmon@keene.edu</a>). If the student has an EFC between 0 and \$1000, she will be willing to defer that initial deposit. She went on to say that she cannot waive the deposit, but the deferment is something that she is able to do.

## PSU:

- Student goes into the admission portal and accepts the offer of admission in their checklist
  - a. in this checklist item they also agree to the Student Financial Responsibility
    Agreement
  - b. Then submit the form without paying the deposit
- 2. Once they do this, have them email Matt Wallace

## UNH:

The deposit this year is \$550. It is due May 1. Please have your students do this in a timely manner. And their financial aid file at UNH needs to be complete to be able to this waiver as Admissions does check with financial aid.

This is what they do:

To waiver/defer the deposits at UNH:

Have the student Email Danielle Zananiri at UNH Admission. Her email is: Danielle Zananiri Danielle.Zananiri@unh.edu

Identify themself and give their student ID number. It is on their request for deposit form. Indicate their high school as well.

Have them state that they are a participant in the Educational Talent Search program. Have them request a waiver/deferment of the Tuition and Housing Deposit. Have them request a reply from him.

The student does need to go Online and complete the Housing and Dining Choices (if they are living on campus)
